

2025 MEGGENDORFER PRIZE FOR BEST ARTIST BOOK

In conjunction with the 2025 MBS conference in St. Louis, MO

Qualifying books must include pop-up and/or movable structures and must have been created in the past 2 years. Artists must be at least 21 years of age.

Initial selection occurs through video submissions. The MBS Board narrows the field to 10 books. A jury chooses the winner from the 10 finalists by viewing the physical books at the 2025 MBS Conference. Books will not be handled by the general public.

Entries must include one video per book and a descriptive statement of less than 250 words. One or two books can be submitted for consideration. Videos must not exceed 3 minutes. Send Youtube or Vimeo video links and this pdf form to:

The ten finalist books will be displayed the MBS meeting in St. Louis, MO in 2025. The winner will receive a trophy and \$250 USD. The first runner-up will receive \$125 USD. The second runner-up will also be announced. Finalists are encouraged to make their book available for sale at the conference.

HIROMI TAKEDA is a book artist based in Japan. She specializes in botanical work as a pop-up book and card designer. She contributed the letter J to the A to Z: Marvels in Paper Engineering volume published by the Movable Book Society in 2022. Takeda was awarded the 2023 Meggendorfer Prize for Best Artist Book from the Movable Book Society.

MAY CASTLEBERRY edited the Contemporary Editions series published by the Library Council of The Museum of Modern Art from 2000 to 2024. Between 1984 and 2000, she was librarian at the Whitney Museum as well as editor of a series of limited-edition artist's books that brought together original art and new writing. At the Whitney and elsewhere, she organized numerous exhibitions focused on books, photographs, and works on paper.
